

Hardcore pornography defined:

Illegal, unclassified, "gonzo" or hard-core XXX, "free online material that depicts individuals or groups engaging in sexual behaviours where inequity between the parties is clear, violence is observed or audible, where degradation, humiliation, punishment and extreme submission appear to be the general objective of the power dynamics or behaviour depicted.

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CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

- Given the research on the impact of early exposure to porn, could children and young people's exposure to pornography be considered sexual abuse in and of itself?
- The impact of exposure (whether via adults, children or themselves) can induce trauma and premature sexualization that is a form of child sexual abuse.
- Previous generations would have only been exposed to such graphic and violent sexual content through sexual abuse.
- Relating to pornography harms, why are the laws that are in place to protect children from sexual and wider harms, not enacted?
- How is pornography grooming children to be at risk for both online and offline exploitation?
- How is pornography being used as a 'how to' manual for engaging in sexually abusive behaviours towards other children?
- How does toxic porn culture normalise exploitation (e.g. sexting) amongst young people?
- What messages does porn provide to youth who are exploring their sense of self and sexuality?

Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse

This view of the negative effect of pornography on children's sexual behaviours is consistent with evidence Australian treatment providers and academics have submitted to the Royal Commission and other government inquiries. One practitioner who treats children with harmful sexual behaviours told us at a private roundtable:

'I can't think of anything that is going to impact us or what is actually happening for our young kids as much as the easy access of quite hardcore pornography'.

Researched Statement of Harms

Areas of pornography's impact on children and young people include:

- Poor mental health
- Sexism and objectification
- Sexual aggression and violence
- Child-on-child sexual abuse
- Shaping sexual behaviours



In 2009, Dr Michael Flood said:

- Exposure to pornography is routine with a range of notable and often troubling effects. Particularly among younger children, exposure to pornography may be disturbing or upsetting.
- Exposure to pornography helps to sustain young people's adherence to sexist and unhealthy notions of sex and relationships.
- While children and young people are sexual beings and deserve ageappropriate materials on sex and sexuality, pornography is a poor, and indeed dangerous, sex educator.

Porn Harms Kids Report

Children having access to pornography is essentially,

child sexual abuse via digital images.



Sexual Media Scripts

Are more likely to be applied when they are:

- 1. exclusive
- 2. formative
- 3. resonant
- 4. reinforced


Alternatively, when other sexual scripts are...

- early
- persistent and
- reinforced

...this can result in a LOWER likelihood of viewers applying sexual media scripts.

Model of Script Sources

- Information regarding sexuality
 may not shape preferences and
 expectations as strongly as sexual
 experience itself.
- However, if the family is the first source of information, they will likely be a strong initial influence for understanding and interpreting sexuality.


Jack's family was a strong source of initial influence, with sexuality openly discussed in the home. He was introduced to porn at age 13. He rejected porn at first, but normalised porn use amongst peers meant that he felt left out if he didn't share porn stories. He now uses porn daily and wants to try out porn acts on his partner.

Jenny's family didn't talk about sex and she first learnt about it from her boyfriend showing her porn. He said that porn was how you learn what to do. He asked her to copy it and perform like the porn performers. As much as sex was painful and she was scared by her boyfriend choking her, Jenny didn't want to disappoint him, and didn't identify his behaviour as abuse. Her boyfriend had no idea he was being abusive Family either. He thought porn sex was what girls wanted. Sexual Peers Sexual Script Media Romantic Partners Cameron had no idea about sex until someone showed them hardcore porn at age 11. They think sex is horrible and they don't want to have anything to do with it. They now identify as non-binary and asexual.

The Relationship Among Online Sexually Explicit Material Exposure to, Desire for, and Participation in Rough Sex

- New research reveals that it's common for those who have been exposed to rough sex in pornography to both desire and engage in those acts.
- Rough Sex is defined as hair pulling, spanking, scratching, biting, bondage, fisting, and double penetration.
- 91.4% of 19-30 year old's surveyed who had been exposed to sexually explicit material desired to engage in one or more of these behaviours.
- 81.7% had engaged in one or more behaviours
- Almost half of the study participants (49.5%) engaged in four or more rough sex behaviours.

Health education's role in framing pornography as a public health issue


Social issues from the public health perspective involve problems that affect individuals or groups beyond their capacity to correct.

Social issues are detectable when responsibility is shifted from individuals being able to adequately make changes themselves, toward holding external social causes or influences accountable.

It is clear that many aspects of pornography meet this definition of social issue, and warrant public health advocacy efforts.





- Age-verification has the potential to reduce predator access to children




